Warm Homes Newsletter Summer 2020 Issue 1

With the average home energy bill now being £1,340 per year, the Warm Homes Campaign from Durham County Council helps residents to have a warmer home and lower energy bills.

Do you need gas central heating?

We are working with E-ON Energy and 0800 Repair to replace old solid fuel back boilers or electric storage or room heaters. If you qualify you could receive a grant of up to £6,000* for the following:

- New gas connection to your home (within 23 meters of the gas mains)
- New energy efficient wall mounted gas boiler
- New central heating radiators in all rooms

To qualify you will need to:

- Be an owner occupier or rent from a private landlord**
- Use solid fuel and have no more than one radiator installed in your home
- Or have electric storage radiators
- Have a total household income less that £26,000 or be in receipt of a qualifying benefit (see page 2 for info)
- Or have a cold related illness

Apply as soon as possible as numbers are limited.

Do you have an old gas boiler?

The Government Energy Company Obligation (ECO) scheme provides low income households and households in receipt of a qualifying Benefit (see page 2 for info) with grants for energy efficiency improvements such as new gas boilers, cavity wall insulation, partly wall and loft insulation***. Contact us and ask for information on the ECO schemes currently available.

Do you have cold related ill health?

Our warm and healthy homes scheme can help private households who have a cold related illness and are having problems with their gas boiler*. You will need to complete our application form and also get it signed by a health or social care.

Warm Homes Discount

Energy companies must, by law, offer extra help to their most vulnerable customers during the winter months. If you're a pensioner, or you're on a low income, you could qualify for a rebate of £140 off your energy bill. Residents can contact us for advice on how to find out if they qualify for a Warm Homes Discount.

To qualify for a grant households must be receipt of one of the following benefits: DLA or PIP; Attendance Allowance or Pension or Tax Credits; Income Related Employment and Support Allowance; Income based Job Seekers Allowance; Income Support, State Pension Credit; Tax Credits (income thresholds apply); Universal Credit (income thresholds apply); Carers Allowance or Industrial Injury or ESA income related; Council Tax Reduction Benefit and/or Housing Benefit or have a total household income less than £26,000.
